PRESS NOTE

Subject: Schedule for the General Elections to the Legislative Assemblies of Assam, Kerala, Tamil Nadu, West Bengal and Pondicherry.

The terms of the Legislative Assemblies of Tamil Nadu, Assam, Kerala, Pondicherry and West Bengal will expire on 21.05.2006, 29.05.2006, 04.06.2006, 08.06.2006 and 13.06.2006 respectively. As per the established practice, the Election Commission holds the General Elections to the Legislative Assemblies of the States and Union Territories, whose terms expire almost at the same time, together. By virtue of its powers, duties and functions under Article 324 read with Article 172(1) of the Constitution of India, Section 15 of Representation of the People Act, 1951, and section 5 of the Government of Union Territories Act, 1963 the Commission is under mandate to hold elections to constitute the new Legislative Assemblies in the States of Assam, Kerala, Tamil Nadu, West Bengal and UT of Pondicherry before expiry of their present terms.

ASSEMBLY CONSTITUENCIES

2. There are 126 Assembly Constituencies (ACs) in Assam, 140 ACs in Kerala, 234 ACs in Tamil Nadu, 294 ACs in West Bengal and 30 ACs in Pondicherry. In Assam, out of 126 ACs, 8 are reserved for the Scheduled Castes and 16 for Scheduled Tribes. In Kerala, out of 140 ACs, 13 are reserved for the Scheduled Castes and 1 for Scheduled Tribes. In Tamil Nadu, out of 234 ACs, 42 are reserved for the Scheduled Castes and 03 for Scheduled Tribes. In West Bengal out of 294 ACs, 59 are reserved for the Scheduled Castes and 17 for Scheduled Tribes, and in Pondicherry out of 30 ACs, 5 are reserved for the Scheduled Castes and none for Scheduled Tribes.

ELECTORAL ROLLS

3. The electoral rolls for the State of Assam with 01.01.2006 as the qualifying date were finally published on 10.02.2006. As on that date about 1.74 crore electors were enrolled in the State. The electoral rolls in the State of Kerala with reference to 01.01.2006 as qualifying date (except for ACs falling in Kasargod and in Palghat districts) were published on 27.02.2006. In these rolls, about 1.86 crore electors stood enrolled. The electoral rolls in respect of ACs falling in Kasargod and Palghat districts, with reference to 01.01.2006 as qualifying date, will be published on 04.03.2006. The electoral rolls with reference to 01.01.2006 as qualifying date, in the State of West Bengal were published on 22.02.2006 and as on that date about 4.89 crore electors stood included in the rolls. For UT of Pondicherry, the electoral rolls with reference to 01.01.2006 as qualifying date, were published on 24.02.2006 and 25.02.2006 with approximately 6.5 lakh electors enrolled. The final electoral rolls in the State of Tamil Nadu with reference to 01.01.2006 as qualifying date are due for final publication on 07.03.2006.

4. In all the four States of Assam, Kerala, Tamil Nadu, West Bengal and UT of Pondicherry, the electoral rolls have been computerised and are available on the website of respective Chief Electoral Office and also on the website of the Commission. In the State of Kerala and UT of Pondicherry, the electoral rolls are with photographs. The General Elections to the Legislative Assemblies of Kerala and UT of Pondicherry will be held for the first time with the help of electoral rolls with photographs. In the State of West Bengal, electoral rolls have been prepared with photographs in respect of 46 ACs also for the first time. The electoral rolls with photographs while on one hand help establish identity of the voters, on other it eliminates the chances of bogus voting.

ELECTORS PHOTO IDENTITY CARDS (EPIC)

5. Identification of voters at the polling booth at the time of poll shall be mandatory. In the State of Assam, no EPIC Programme could be started due to various reasons. In

the States of Kerala, Tamil Nadu, West Bengal and UT of Pondicherry, the coverage under EPIC programme is approx. 99.8%, 55%, 92.13% and 99.9% respectively. The effort is being made to maximize the coverage under EPIC programme in these States and UT of Pondicherry. A new campaign has been launched in the State of Tamil Nadu to increase the coverage under EPIC significantly from this month.

ELECTRONIC VOTING MACHINES (EVMs)

6. The Commission has made arrangements for providing the required number of EVMs in the States of Assam, Kerala, Tamil Nadu, West Bengal and UT of Pondicherry already. The forthcoming General Elections in these States and UT of Pondicherry will be conducted with the help of EVMs.

INDELIBLE INK

7. Till recently indelible ink was being applied as a dot on the joint between the nail and the skin of the left forefinger of the electors in order to prevent bogus voting. The Commission has now decided that the indelible ink during forthcoming general elections will be applied as a line running from top of the nail to the bottom of first joint of the left fore-finger.

LAW AND ORDER AND DEPLOYMENT OF FORCES

8. Central Para-Military Forces (CPMFs) will be provided to the four States and UT of Pondicherry for confidence building, maintaining law and order and providing security to the electors, candidates, polling personnel and EVMs. The forces will be deployed in various ACs in consultation with the Observers.

9. The District Magistrates will make detailed review for assessment of all licensed arm holders, and if considered necessary shall get their arms deposited in the District Armoury etc., for the period of elections.

RETURNING OFFICERS

10. Quite often, one officer acts as the Returning Officer for more than one AC, sometimes even for 3-4 ACs. The Commission has observed that if an officer is made Returning Officer for more than two ACs, he is unable to devote enough time to ACs under his charge. In order to increase the attention of the Returning Officers, the Commission has decided that no officer will act as Returning Officer for more than two ACs in the States of Assam, Kerala, Tamil Nadu and West Bengal. However, in case of Pondicherry where ACs are small both in terms of number of electors and geographical area, the Commission has allowed one officer to handle maximum of three ACs.

OBSERVERS

11. The Commission will be deploying sufficient number of General and Expenditure Observers to ensure smooth conduct of forthcoming General Elections. The Observers will be asked to keep a close watch on the electoral process to ensure free and fair elections.

CONDUCT OF OFFICIALS

12. The Commission expects all officials engaged in the conduct of elections to discharge their duties in an impartial manner without any fear. Several instructions have been issued from time to time to ensure impartiality of officials who are engaged in conduct of elections and their non-involvement in the electoral politics. The conduct of all government officials who have been entrusted with election related responsibilities and duties would remain under constant scrutiny of the Commission and strict action shall be taken against those officials who are found wanting on any account.

13. The Commission has already given instructions that no election related official or police officer of the rank of Sub Inspector and above shall be allowed to continue in his home district. Instructions have also been issued that these officials will not be allowed to continue in the same district if they have completed three years in that district during last

four years. The posts of Sergeant Major or equivalent who are responsible for deployment of forces have also been covered for transfer under these instructions. The Governments of four States and UT of Pondicherry have also been asked to transfer all those officers against whom the Commission has recommended disciplinary action or who have been charged for any lapse during previous elections or for any election related work from the posts entailing election work.

14. The Governments of four States and UT of Pondicherry have been instructed to ensure that those who stand transferred should move out physically of their last place of posting and not remain there on any pretext including leave.

15. The Commission has also instructed the State Governments of four States and UT of Pondicherry not to associate any officer with the electoral process against whom charges have been framed in a court of law.

POLLING STATIONS

16. In order to facilitate voting, the Commission has decided to open auxiliary polling stations in the same building for booths where number of electors exceeds 1200 and provide additional polling personnel at polling stations where such booths cannot be opened. For the facility of disabled persons instructions have been issued to ensure that all polling booths are located at ground floor and ramps are provided.

POLLING PARTIES AND RANDOMIZATION

17. The polling parties shall be formed through the process of randomization utilizing a common software programme approved by the Commission. The Central Government employees will be deployed for the forthcoming elections to the extent possible.

COMMUNICATION SYSTEM

18. The District Election Officers in all the four States and UT of Pondicherry have been asked to set up a comprehensive communication system, dovetailing all resources like landline telephones, mobile telephones, wireless sets etc., to facilitate quick complaint redressal on the day of poll. They have also been asked to open Helplines / Control Rooms in each AC for the convenience of electors.

VIDEOGRAPHY

19. The Commission has issued detailed guidelines for videography of all critical events during the election process and polling at sensitive / hypersensitive polling booths on the poll day. The digital cameras will also be deployed inside the booths depending upon their availability to the extent possible.

PROTECTION TO SC/ST ELECTORS

20. As per Section 3 (1) (vii) of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989, whoever, not being a member of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe, forces or intimidates a member of a Scheduled Caste or a Scheduled Tribe not to vote or to vote to a particular candidate or to vote in a manner other than that provided by law; shall be punishable with imprisonment of a term which shall not be less than six months but which may extend to five years and with fine. The Commission has asked the State Government to bring these provisions to the notice of all concerned for prompt action.

MODEL CODE OF CONDUCT

21. The Model Code of Conduct comes into effect immediately from now onwards. The Code will apply to the whole of the States of Assam, Kerala, Tamil Nadu, West Bengal and UT of Pondicherry and will be applicable to all candidates, political parties, the Governments of the States of Assam, Kerala, Tamil Nadu, West Bengal and UT of

Pondicherry and Union Government in so far as these four States and UT of Pondicherry are concerned.

SCHEDULE

22. The Commission has prepared the schedule for holding General Elections to the Legislative Assemblies of Assam, Kerala, Tamil Nadu, West Bengal and Pondicherry after taking into consideration all relevant aspects like the school examination schedules, various festivals, prevailing law and order situation including the problems posed by the insurgent, naxalists in the States of Assam and West Bengal, availability of Central Para Military Forces (CPMFs), time needed for movement and proper deployment of forces, the likely onset of monsoon in Assam and after assessment of ground realities made by the Chief Election Commissioner, Election Commissioners and various teams of the during their visits to these States and UT of Pondicherry.

23. The Commission after considering all relevant aspects has decided to recommend to the Governors of the States of Assam, Kerala, Tamil Nadu, West Bengal and Lieutenant Governor of the UT of Pondicherry to issue notification for the said General Elections to the Legislative Assemblies of Assam, Kerala, Tamil Nadu, West Bengal and UT of Pondicherry under the relevant provisions of the Representation of the People Act, 1951, as per the schedules given in the Annexures I to V.
